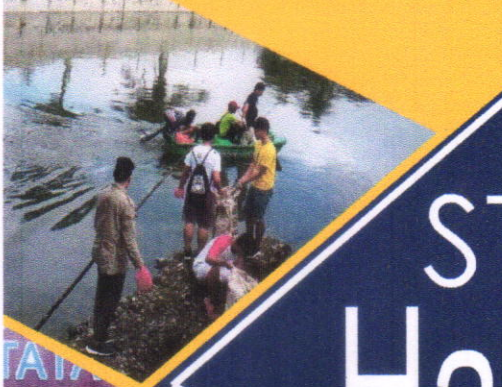

Foreword


